The Jewellery program contributes to the diversity of NSCAD through hands-on research into materials and fabrication that includes both traditional practices and new technology. The program produces award-winning professionals who are successful entrepreneurs, educators and accomplished exhibiting artists and researchers.

Priority will be given to candidates with an active studio/research practice in tandem with advanced traditional jewellery fabrication skills and aptitude with digital fabrication methods. Knowledge of jewellery history and understanding of contemporary craft discourse is considered an asset. The selected candidate should have a strong vision for the future of the field and will help shape evolving curriculum. Teaching will be at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

APPLICATIONS Candidates must have a minimum MFA in Jewellery Design and Metalsmithing, active research and/or professional practice, and college-level teaching experience. Applications must be in PDF format and include a curriculum vitae, statement of teaching philosophy and research interests, as well as the names and contact information of three referees.
