

NSCAD University invites applications for Tenure Track/Tenured Position at the (Assistant/Associate/Professor) in Craft History/Material Cultures.

NSCAD University is in Mi'kma'ki, on the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq Nation. NSCAD University has committed to reconciliation and to establishing respectful ongoing relationships with Indigenous peoples.

We seek an esteemed researcher whose accomplishments have made a major impact in areas of craft and material culture. We encourage applications from outstanding and innovative researchers who work in arts-based research with particular focus on methodologies, historical and theoretical scholarship, and who also have a demonstrated commitment to equity and decolonization in their practice.

The candidate will hold knowledge and expertise at least one of the following research areas:

Art History and Cultural Studies; Craft History; Material Culture; Art Education; Indigenous Studies and Diaspora Studies, Post-colonial Studies, Critical Race Studies, Gender and LGBTQ2+ Studies, and Museums and Curatorial Studies with a particular emphasis on community engagement, resurgence, resilience, strength-based frameworks, and place-based perspectives. Lived experiences of making and working with communities is also an asset.

The successful candidate will teach histories and theories of craft, design, and material culture. The search is open to scholars from various disciplines; preference will be given to candidates with expertise in craft and material culture in emerging or underrepresented fields. Additional expertise in histories and theories of collecting or museums will be considered an asset.

The ideal candidate will enhance cross-university research and pedagogical collaboration by partnering with departments, programs, and faculties including the Craft Division and the Dr. Sandra Alfoldy Craft Institute. The successful candidate will be expected to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels and will participate in graduate student supervision (MFA, MAED and MDES). We seek an accomplished colleague who will join us in this journey of respectful engagement in developing research directly relevant to and in relationship with communities, and in leading the university in exciting new directions in relation to craft, material culture, innovative interdisciplinary arts practice and scholarship. Through an outstanding, ongoing program of research and graduate training, the candidate will contribute to NSCAD's Academic Plan: Towards 2020.

## The selection committee will evaluate candidates based on their:

- -demonstrated leadership or potential as leaders in their fields
- -innovative research potential or an established research profile of the highest quality
- -active, original, innovative program of high quality research and a vision for its future directions
- -record of attracting and supervising graduate students and/or mentorship

- -demonstrated responsiveness and respectful development of community engagement to include work with students
- -demonstrated contribution to equity, diversity, and inclusion initiatives
- -demonstrated excellence in teaching
- -holding a PhD in a relevant discipline, or equivalent

The anticipated start date for this position is July 1, 2020. Application materials should include:

- A cover letter providing an overview of the candidate's qualifications and how they fulfill the above-listed criteria

- A teaching dossier that documents the applicant's experience in and approach to training and mentoring diverse students, and teaching effectiveness, to include examples of syllabi and student work, teaching philosophy, examples of community connections, collaborative outputs, and work with community members such as elders and youth.
