The successful candidate will:

- ☐ Demonstrate excellence in teaching and student supervision
- ☐ Have earned an MFA degree or equivalent

Consistent with NSCAD's criteria for appointment, the selection committee will evaluate candidates based on their: 1) potential as leaders in their fields; 2) original, innovative proposed research program of the highest quality; 3) record of mentoring students; and 4) active national, international exhibition or public presentation record.
