We seek an innovative candidate in the area of Photography, whose accomplishments have demonstrated the potential to make a major impact in this field. We encourage applications from outstanding photo-based artists with a developed practice.

The candidate will hold knowledge and expertise in the in one or several of the following areas:

- Contemporary digital photographic applications and practices.
- Historical and contemporary photographic discourses.
- Silver-based photographic techniques and practices.
- Interdisciplinary/expanded photographic practices.

As articulated in *NSCAD's Strategic Research Plan* (2019-22), NSCAD's research is driven by the goal to be a leaderin in four distinct areas: Visual and Cultural Literacies, Sustainability and Adaptability, Material Exploration, and Art/Design Education and Pedagogy with reimagined Infrastructure underpinning those themes. We commit to supporting research centres, institutes, networks, and clusters, including those well-established, emerging, or proposed, as a way to support interdisciplinary collaboration.

We seek a colleague who will join us in this journey of respectful engagement in developing practice, research and approaches to teaching directly relevant to and in relationship with communities, and in leading the university in exciting new directions in relation to arts practice and scholarship (see *NSCAD University Academic Plan: Towards 2020-2025*).

## Requirements

The successful candidate will:

- Have an active, original, and innovative practice and a vision for its future directions.
- Demonstrate excellence in teaching as well as undergraduate and graduate student supervision.
- Have practice, research and pedagogical approaches that are responsive to and respectful of the needs of communities and students.
- Have earned a terminal degree in a relevant discipline.

Consistent with NSCAD's criteria for appointment, the selection committee will evaluate candidates based on their: 1) active national and international exhibition record; 2) record of mentoring students; and 3) potential as leaders in their fields.
