We seek an exemplary candidate with knowledge and expertise in metalworking specific to Hollowware and Jewellery. They must be proficient in silversmithing design processes and techniques such as; forging, sinking, raising, planishing, anti-clastic forming, patination as well as the fabrication of larger objects.

Other areas of expertise may include but are not limited to:

- Jewellery production methods and/or well-experience in wax carving, casting & mold-making methods
- Design for Hollowware/Flatware manufacturing in metal
- 3D digital design (Rhino 3D) and Digital Fabrication Technologies including 3d Printing

Requirements

The successful candidate will:

- Be an active practitioner with an original and innovative body of research/creation work and a vision for its future directions;
- Demonstrate excellence in teaching and student supervision;
- Be sensitive to diversity in teaching and learning approaches, and respectful to the needs of communities and students;
- Have earned a terminal degree in the relevant discipline;
- Become actively involved in service requirements and committees at the departmental, divisional and University levels.

Consistent with NSCAD's criteria for appointment, the selection committee will evaluate candidates based on their: 1) potential as leaders in their fields; 2) original, innovative proposed research program of the highest quality; 3) record of mentoring students; and 4) active national and international exhibition record.
