



NSCAD University's Division of Art History and Contemporary Culture invites applications for a Tenure-track/Tenured Position at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor from scholars who specialize in the broadly defined areas of histories, theories and philosophies of art practices including those that fall outside the European-based canon and centralize global, diasporic and/or racialized cultural production. This position will include the teaching of undergraduate courses for students who may be Art History majors or minors and students who may be Studio majors in painting, sculpture, printmaking, photography, film, jewelry, ceramics, textiles and design. And, depending on the successful candidate's interests and experiences, will also encompass courses for students in NSCAD's MFA and MAED graduate programs as well as opportunities to supervise independent studies at the undergraduate and graduate level and to supervise graduate student theses.

This position is restricted to candidates who are Indigenous, Black or persons of colour as part of NSCAD's on-going implementation of anti-racist practices, commitment to reconciliation with Indigenous peoples and the dismantling of oppressive institutional structures. We welcome applications from non-Canadians but, in accordance with Canadian Immigration requirements, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. NSCAD University invites and encourages applications from all qualified individuals, including those within the employment equity categories of women, persons with disabilities, members of visible minorities, Indigenous persons, individuals of diverse gender and sexual orientation and all groups protected by the Human Rights Code.

Academic qualifications include a PhD or equivalent body of knowledge and evidence of dissemination of research. Teaching experience is considered an asset.
