



CALL FOR PROPOSALS: Sustainability in Craft

Would \$1,000 help you integrate greater sustainability into your craft practice? Funds can be used (but are not limited) to: experiment with new materials, work with a mentor, attend a conference, or integrate sustainable practices in exhibition-building. This is an excellent opportunity to build on your research interests and coursework!

The Craft Division is offering **five undergraduate \$1,000 scholarships** to support sustainable craft research and making in Winter 2025 as part of the Sow to Sew (S2S) Project. This new initiative will highlight new approaches to material sourcing, craft-based research, local ecology and economies, and sustainable making. We would like to hear what these threads mean to you and the work you are engaged in. The application is open to all **BFA students who situate their work in a craft-based approach.**

What is needed to apply?

- A one-page written proposal (max. 500 words);
- Visual support of your concept (5 visuals or a link to a film/website with a descriptive index for the images);
- A short timeline for your activities;
- And name of a faculty member willing to oversee your project.

Your outcome results may be shared on the S2S website and may be used for NSCAD communications and promotion, with individuals credited for their efforts.
