

Subject to budgetary consideration, NSCAD University invites applications for a 24-month Limited Term Sessional at the rank of Assistant Professor in Animation in the Division of Media Arts.

Teaching duties will include some of the following:

- FILM-2220 Introductory Animation
- FILM-2502 Introduction to 3D Animation
- FILM-2503 Intermediate 2D Animation
- FILM-3461 Stop Motion Animation
- FILM-3101 Animation Studio 1
- FILM-4101 Animation Studio 2

It is our expectation that all courses will be taught in person at the NSCAD Academy Campus.

We seek a candidate in the Department of Media Arts at the rank of assistant professor, and we encourage applications from studio-based researchers who work in areas of digital and analog animation and have indepth knowledge of contemporary theory and practice. The candidate will have expertise in both industry and academic settings and will have a thorough knowledge of methodologies in various forms of animation. They should also have a critical understanding of animation and media arts within the context of postsecondary education. NSCAD is considering the possibilities of a Major in Animation & Illustration, and we seek a colleague who will contribute to our vision and planning. The successful candidate will be part of a vibrant, multi-disciplinary Film and Expanded Media community.

We encourage candidates with specialization and expertise in the following technical and research areas of animation:

- 2D and 3D animation, with competence in Toon Boom Harmony, Dragon Frame and Blender
- Character Drawing, Digital and Traditional Drawing for Animation

In addition to this expertise, candidates will have competence with:

- 3D modeling and Texturing
- Game Engines, World Building and Immersive Technologies
- History of Global and National Animation Practices
- Basic lighting and camera work for Animation productions.

Requirements

The successful candidate will have:

- An active research practice in animation, which supports ability to contribute to a research vision and a plan for developing animation at NSCAD
- Willingness to engage with local and international industry for possible internships and partnerships.
- An ongoing and engaging professional practice in animation, with a history of publication and critical discourse on animation
- Demonstrated excellence in teaching and student supervision in Animation in the post-secondary contexts.
- An MFA or other terminal degree in art or design, or equivalent professional experience

Consistent with NSCAD's criteria for appointment, the selection committee will evaluate candidates based on their:

- potential as leaders in their field(s);
- original, innovative research program;
- record of mentoring (undergraduate and graduate students); and
- active national and international exhibition (public presentation) record.

- A portfolio of 15-20 images representing one's current direction of work
- A portfolio of 10 images of student work
