Recruitment for Diversity: Reviewed all recruitment processes for bias, EDIA changes and CRC appointment principles; changes in advertising, attraction, sources and hiring process

Due to the changes in processes, and approaches (including union approaches to equivalencies), we were able to recruit, hire and support a new faculty member to becoming our CRC Tier 2.

Describe any challenges encountered in undertaking this action, and any mitigation strategies that were employed. (required)

Organizational concerns around success changed how the university utilized the \$100,000 to support the CRC's research rather than just covering their salary which had been the practice previously, This change in financial support meant a greater commitment from the university as well as ensuring that the faculty were hired to be within the faculty complement, rather than outside, which had added undue hardship on the university in the past. The EDIA audit was a catalyst for changing these internal practices.
